


Tax and financial incentives:

Tonote: Total tax exemption of benefits for up to 10 years granted to companies operating in regional development zones.

- Exports to Greece: 80,4 millions DT (clothing, semi-finished goods and textiles, agricultural products, sea products, phosphates and chemicals, hydrocarbons...)
- Imports from Greece: 673 millions DT (cotton, tobacco, machinery and equipment, hydrocarbons, chemicals, pelts, foodstuffs..)
